
United States Stamps & Covers to see what was accomplished.






I will only illustrate the Plate # position block of 8 from each pane of 100 stamps. See the auction lot description following the illustrations. Gum breakers and sheet margins determine where the plate number would have been printed on regular stamps.



The above image is the upper left (Plate # position) corner block of 8 cropped from a pane of 100 of TD84A. There was another blank pane of 100 on different paper in this lot.




The above image is the lower right (Plate # position) corner block of 8 cropped from a pane of 100 of TD84A defaced with blue crayon lines.



Proposed Future DSSG Project

Updating Research Paper Number 3 - Dummy Stamp Booklets

Work is progressing on updating Research Paper Number 3 - Dummy Stamp Booklets. The last update by Dummy Booklets Study Group Chairman Earl McAfee, was in 1998. Since then there have been many new discoveries. Many of them have been written up in articles in The United States Specialist. Now the time has come to document and illustrate them in a new updated version of Research Paper Number 3 - Dummy Stamp Booklets. I am working closely with Mike Perry on this update project. We know that it will take quite a bit of time to complete, mid to late 2015 is hopefully our estimated completion

date. I will be asking all of you to join us in this project as we are not able to do it all, nor would you want us to do it all. It is a DSSG project and all members should have a chance to provide their input. Several illustrations are needed and a listing of these will be sent to you when it is compiled. Scans at 300 dpi, or better, are necessary for clarity. It is anticipated that this publication will be in color. It has not yet been determined if *Research Paper Number 3 - Dummy Stamp Booklets* will be available electronically.
